**KHARKIV SCHOOL AS THE CENTER OF THE FORMATION
OF THE FAMOUS ECONOMIST, NOBEL LAUREATE SIMON
(SIMEON) KUZNETS**

Summary

Simon Kuznets, along with Ilya Mechnikov and Lev Landau is one of three Nobel laureates, life and scientific work are related to Kharkov. But until recently his Kharkov period of life was little known. Its growth in early life and progress in science were subtle at times, full of military events. Only troublesome work Kharkov enabled researchers reproduction of historical facts difficult years.

Typically, a student of Simon Kuznets see a prominent American economist, creator of the National Bureau of Economic Research Wesley C. Mitchell. His great intellectual respect he gives himself S.
